Dear Saint Mary School Families,



Dear Saint Mary School Families,

Below is some important information regarding registration fees and paperwork due for the 2011-2012 school year. The changes are related to timing and dates, not to any increases or changes in amounts.

In order to clarify and improve our budgeting and enrollment processes we are moving the dates for registration and payment of fees to earlier in the year. These changes follow changes made at diocesan schools much like last year's changes to tuition payment method which went smoothly. Registration fees and paperwork will be due by April 21, 2011. This modest change is supported by the school's finance committee and will improve both visibility on incoming students and also collections.

Timely submission of both registration fees and paperwork secures your child's spot for the 2011-2012 school year. Partial packets will not be accepted and will be returned to you for completion. On April 22, open spaces will be made available to new students.

The registration fee will remain at \$400 per student. Registration fees cover many items which will be detailed for you on the paperwork that will be sent home March 23rd.

Tuition payments will continue to run from August through May.

Please mark your calendar to make sure you have your payment and paperwork turned in on time. If you have any questions or concerns, you can contact me at sedwards@csdo.org


Dear Saint Mary School Families,

In the case of a large, very damaging incident, we will have this plan in place so that we are better prepared to adjust and modify the safety of our school community to the needs of the moment. Being prepared and proactive is the main objective of our Emergency Preparedness Plan. We pray for non-emergency school days.

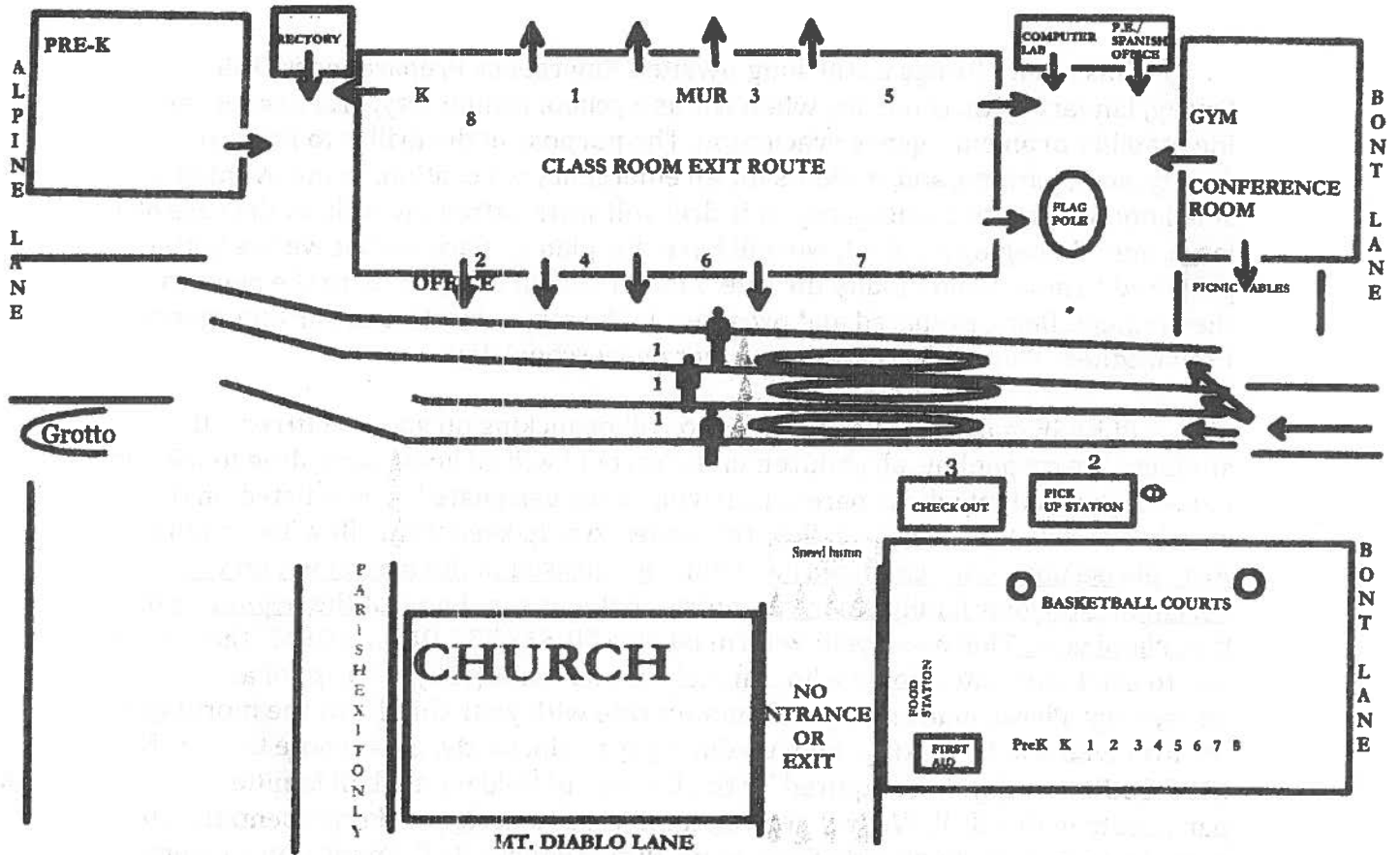
PLEASE make sure you set up who will be picking up your child(ren). If students are carpooling, all children in the carpool will go home according to the last name of the student whose parent is driving. Your designated time is listed on the attached instructions. Please follow this order to help keep traffic flowing smoothly. Also, please note, your child(ren) will only be released to the person whom you designated on your family emergency form that was sent home at the beginning of the school year. This was a yellow form labeled "DISASTER DRILL FORM" that asked you to list 4 alternate people who can pick up your child(ren) in a case of an emergency. Please make sure you communicate with your child(ren) the morning of the drill who will be picking them up during the drill. Lastly, please note there is NO KIDS CLUB that day. It is required by the Diocese of Oakland that all families participate in this drill. We will need all families, or a designated representative, to participate in our school-wide Emergency Preparedness Drill. Thank you so much for your cooperation and attentiveness in following the directions for this drill. We are grateful for all you do, and we continue to strive to make sure your child(ren) are safe here at Saint Mary School.

We will proceed with the drill rain or shine. Also, your child may wear jeans with his or her uniform top and sweatshirt on the day of the drill.

Emergency Preparedness Plan A
Updated 11/7/2010
Evacuation Drill Objective/Mission**

The purpose of the drill is to prepare faculty, staff, parents, and students for the inevitability of an emergency evacuation. In the event of a small non-destructive emergency, this drill will work extremely well. In the case of a large, very damaging incident, we will have this plan in place so that we are better prepared to adjust and modify the safety of our school community to the needs of the moment. Being prepared and proactive is the main objective of our Emergency Preparedness Plan. We pray for non-emergency school days.

On the day of the school evacuation drill, JANUARY 14, 2011 all students may wear jean pants for the bottom portion of their uniform, accompanied with their regular uniform school shirt and school sweatshirt. This is for the comfort and safety of all students during the drill.

Review the St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception School Emergency Preparedness Plan (available online).

During this drill, follow the diagram of the pick-up protocol attached to the back page of this packet. **Enter at Bont Lane only.**

Follow the cones to the available pick up lane coordinated by the Transportation Team Teachers from grades 1,2,7, and P.E. The pick-up point is in front of the school office with pick-up times as follows:

Last name beginning with **S-Z** arrive at **12:45 P.M.**
Last name beginning with **M-R** arrive at **1:15 P.M.**
Last name beginning with **F-L** arrive at **1:45 P.M.**
Last name beginning with **A-E** arrive at **2:15 P.M.**

Pick up will be slow so we greatly appreciate your patience. We will move as efficiently as possible. **DRIVER PHOTO IDENTIFICATION IS REQUIRED FOR ALL STUDENT PICK UP.**

Please pick up you child/carpool at your designated time. Arriving before or after your assigned time will be difficult for the faculty and for other parents. In the event of a true emergency, parents will arrive randomly and will not need to arrive at their assigned times.

PHOTO ITENDIFICATION WILL ALWAYS BE REQUIRED BY ANYONE PICKING UP A STUDENT. This applies to our drill, as well as in the case of a true emergency.

All cars must follow the diagram attached to the back of this packet. Entrance will only be permitted using Bont Lane and exiting will only be allowed using Alpine.

Student Council students will get students or families and bring them to the "Check Out" station to be dismissed to their parent or carpool's care. Student Council runners will form a line to the right of the "Pick Up" station. Transportation Team Teachers, grades 1,2,7, and P.E., will be coordinating the pick-up lanes. Parents are to remain in their car, and traffic control teachers will communicate with the "Pick Up" station. Be sure to have your photo ID ready in order to pick up your child, carpool, or family. **PHOTO IDENTIFICATION WILL ALWAYS BE REQUIRED.**

Once students have been checked out at the "Check Out" station, students will be escorted to their car by the Transportation Team. Please remain in your car **at all times.**

Exit the school site by passing the school on the right and exiting on Alpine.

All students not picked up by 2:45 will be escorted to Kids' Club immediately following the conclusion of the drill.

Faculty will debrief for 20 minutes following the conclusion of the emergency drill.

Plan A is in effect during good weather.

Plan B:

***In the event of poor weather, such as rain, enclosed areas will be used for the protection of students. The "Pick Up" and "Check Out" stations and procedures will remain the same, as well as photo identification requirements.**

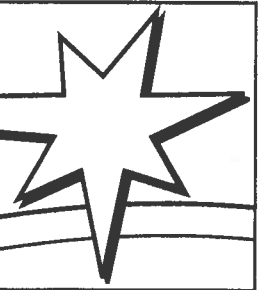

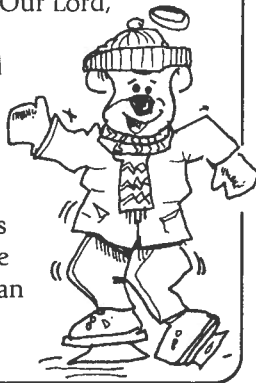


Sunday Rest

Tips from the Holy Family

Give a gentle push when needed. At the wedding feast in Cana, Jesus was reluctant to perform that first public miracle but his mother knew he was ready and capable. At a gentle push from

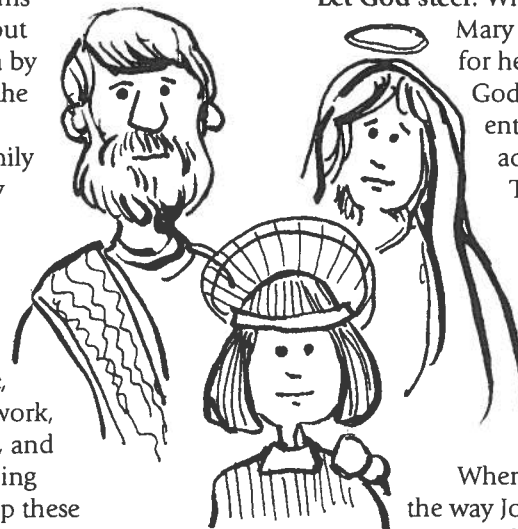
her, he made something wonderful happen.

Let God steer. When the angel told Mary of the plan God had for her life, she allowed God the use of her entire being to accomplish his goals.

Teach children, through prayer and sacrifice, to let God control the direction their lives will take.

Strengthen your own faith and practice.

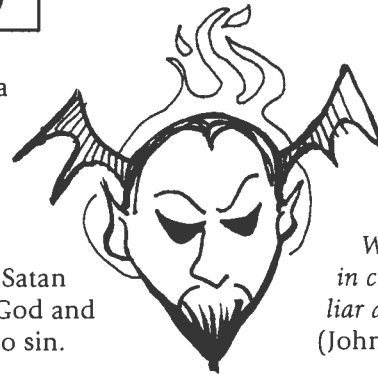
When Jesus was young, the way Joseph lived, how he practiced his faith, and how he answered the boy's questions probably helped to form Jesus' early understanding of God. Be sure your knowledge and practice of your faith is strong so you can properly influence that of your children.



Why Do Catholics Do That?

Satan was originally a beautiful angel in Heaven but led a rebellion against God and was cast out with his henchmen. Also known as "The Devil," Satan wants us to turn from God and continually tempts us to sin.

Who is Satan?



Jesus said, "He was a murderer from the beginning and does not stand in truth, because there is no truth in him.

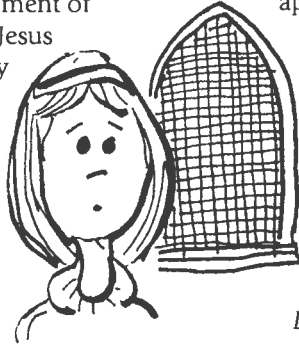
When he tells a lie, he speaks in character, because he is a liar and the father of lies" (John 8:44).

What's so great about Confession?

Confessing sins to a priest is part of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This Sacrament was created by Jesus (John 20:23) to give us the gifts we need to stay strong in virtue and join him in Heaven.

Grace: Grace is the free gift God gives us to help us live lives that please him. We receive sacramental grace during the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Guidance: Many priests offer faith-based advice on how to amend our lives during Confession. If you find that helpful, make an



appointment for a face-to-face Confession or seek Confessions by different local priests to find one with whom you are comfortable.

Unity: Going to Confession as a family shows children that we all make mistakes but God is always ready to forgive us and welcome us back. Forgiveness becomes a family value.

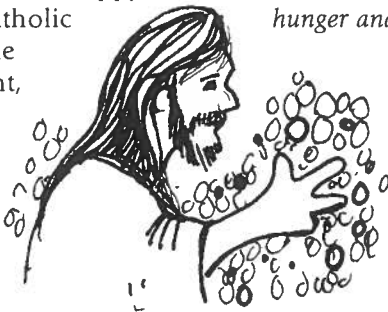
Renewal: The Sacrament of Reconciliation helps us to learn from our mistakes and try again. "For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light" (Ephesians 5:8).

Scripture LESSON

Matthew 5:1-12, paths to happiness

When God created us, he put into our hearts the desire to be happy (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1718). In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus points out the path for happiness, and gives us a compass we can use to navigate our way. Our path to happiness lies in surrendering to God's will and putting all our trust in him.

Jesus said, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, blessed are they who mourn," he promised that when we turn to God in times of trial, we will be comforted



and cared for. When he referred to "the meek, the merciful, those who hunger and thirst for righteousness," he was giving us a compass. We are to measure our behavior against these standards to see if we are on the right path to happiness.

What can a parent do? Read the Sermon on the Mount with your children and teach them to compare their behavior against its standards. Help them to see that Jesus gave us these guidelines to help us be happy on Earth and eventually get to Heaven.

Parent TALK

Money was tight when my husband lost his job. He finally landed another one but it pays a lot less than the old one. After much



prayerful discussion, we decided to sell our current home and move to one that's smaller and more affordable.

None of us wanted to leave. The new one was in a nice neighborhood and had plenty of room but it didn't feel like home. After settling in, I invited our pastor to come over and bless the house. The kids were enthralled by the blessing ceremony Fr. Joe performed. He made a big deal about blessing every surface and, in particular, the rooms where we would spend the most time.

As I was tucking her in that night, our oldest daughter said, "That's why this place didn't feel like home, Mom. Jesus hadn't moved in yet. Now it's all cozy." You know, I completely agree.

Feasts & Celebrations

In January we celebrate the Holy Name of Jesus. "...at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth" (Philippians 2:10). In fact, the English letters IHS – representing the first three Greek letters in Jesus' name – used to be written over the doors of Christian homes.

January 21 – St. Agnes (258). At a young age, St. Agnes pledged chastity for Jesus. Reportedly she was turned in for being a Christian by a suitor whom she refused to marry. She maintained her chastity and her faith and was

executed as a result.

January 31 – St. John Bosco (1888). St. John Bosco combined catechetical training and fatherly guidance to teach young men and women how to unite their spiritual life with their work and play. He opened the Oratory of St. Francis de Sales and provided workshops for boys in shoemaking and tailoring. In 1859, he founded the Salesians who were committed to education and mission work.
